Formative Discipline: Our Words to Their Hearts

I. Why Do We Communicate?

Answer #1: We *image* God when communicate.

Answer #2: We are commanded by God to communicate truth to our kids. (Deuteronomy 6:4-9)

What’s at stake?

“After that whole generation had been gathered to their fathers, another generation grew up, who knew neither the Lord nor what he had done for Israel. Then the Israelites did evil in the eyes of the Lord and served the Baals. They forsook the Lord, the God of their fathers” Judges 2:10-12

We communicate so that our children may know God and what he has done for us in Christ – and in so doing LIVE!

We need to train our children to think biblically. References: Romans 8:29, Psalm 119:105; Isaiah 55:10-11; Heb 4:12; 2 Timothy 3:16.

1 Thessalonians 5:14 – “And we urge you, brothers, warn those who are idle, encourage the timid, help the weak, be patient with everyone.”

Rebuke: A rebuke censures behavior.

Entreaty: Earnest and intense communication; pleading, urging.

Instruction or teaching: The process of providing a lesson, a precept or information that will help your children to understand their world.

Warning: Warnings put our children on guard against a probable danger.

Prayer: Communication with God, but still an essential element of communication between the parent and the child.
