GOD'S PLAN OF REDEMPTION II

- 1. INTRODUCTION
 - 1) Election (God's choice of people to be saved)
 - 2) The Gospel Call (proclaiming/hearing the message of the Gospel)
 - 3) Regeneration (being born again)
 - 4) Conversion (faith and repentance)
 - 5) Justification (right legal standing; righteousness of Christ imputed)
 - 6) Adoption (membership in God's family)
 - 7) Sanctification (growth in obedience and knowledge; increased conformity to Christ)
 - 8) Perseverance (continuing in the faith; abiding in Christ)
 - 9) Death (going to be with the Lord)
 - 10) Glorification (receiving a resurrection body)
- 2. CONVERSION (FAITH & REPENTANCE) (Mark 1:15; Joel 2:12-13; Rom. 2:4; Eph. 2:8-9; Rom. 10:14)

Article VIII, Of Repentance and Faith, CHBC Statement of Faith

We believe that Repentance and Faith are sacred duties, and also inseparable graces, wrought in our souls by the regenerating Spirit of God; whereby being deeply convinced of our guilt, danger and helplessness, and of the way of salvation by Christ, we turn to God with unfeigned contrition, confession, and supplication for mercy; at the same time heartily receiving the Lord Jesus Christ as our Prophet, Priest and King, and relying on Him alone as the only and all sufficient Savior.

Mark 1:15 "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; *repent* and *believe* in the gospel."

a. Repentance

Joel 2:12–13 "'Yet even now,' declares the LORD, 'return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments.' Return to the LORD your God, *for* he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster."

Romans 2:4 "Do you presume on the riches of his kindness and forbearance and patience, not knowing that God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance?"

b. Faith

Ephesians 2:8–9 "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, "not a result of works, so that no one may boast."

Romans 10:14 "How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching?"

3. UNION WITH CHRIST (Eph. 1:3-14; 1 Cor. 1:30; Col. 3:1-4)

Ephesians 1:3 Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing <u>in Christ</u>.

1 Corinthians 1:30-31 It is because of him that you are <u>in Christ Jesus</u>, who has become for us wisdom from God-- that is, our righteousness, holiness and redemption. Therefore, as it is written: "Let him who boasts boast in the Lord."

Believers are justified in Christ, sanctified in Christ, adopted in Christ, preserved in Christ, and glorified in Christ!

4. JUSTIFICATION (Romans 3:20-26, 4:1-5:21; Phil. 3:7-11; 2 Cor. 5:21; Rom. 5:18-19)

Article V, Of Justification, CHBC Statement of Faith

We believe that the great Gospel blessing which Christ secures to such as believe in Him is Justification; that Justification includes the pardon of sin, and the promise of eternal life on principles of righteousness; that it is bestowed, not in consideration of any works of righteousness which we have done, but solely through faith in the Redeemer's blood; by virtue of which faith His perfect righteousness is freely imputed to us of God; that it brings us into a state of most blessed peace and favor with God, and secures every other blessing needful for time and eternity.

2 Corinthians 5:21 "For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God."

Philippians 3:8–9 "Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ "and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith—"

Galatians 2:16 "yet we know that a person is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, so we also have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ and not by works of the law, because by works of the law no one will be justified."
