(vss. 7-11)

Why is God’s word so valuable?

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Summary: God’s Word, in the Scriptures, is his perfect and the primary means of communicating to us directly.

IV. Our Prayerful Response

(vss. 12–14)

The Implied theology of Psalm 19

1. God’s glory, majesty, power and dominion is evident to all through natural revelation in creation. (vss. 1–6; cf. Romans 1)
2. The Scriptures are God’s inerrant and infallible special revelation, revealing his righteous requirements and giving to those who obey them life. (vss. 7–11)
3. Man’s response to God’s revelation, whether natural or special, should be humble repentance and faith. (vss. 12–14)

V. 2 Timothy 3: 14–17– A New Testament Parallel

“But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, and how from infancy you have known the holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.”
